

Build Your Own Elevator Pitch

An elevator speech is a **very short** clear, brief message or “commercial” meant to engage and interest someone in an idea and move to a next step.

	<i>Example: Stepping On</i>	Your Issue
<p>GRAB ATTENTION Smile and open with a statement or question that grabs attention. Briefly tell who you are, what you do, and BE ENGAGING!</p>	<p>Did you know that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An older adult falls in the U.S. every second of every day? • An older adult is treated for a fall in an Emergency Department every 11 seconds! • 27,000 older adults die from falls every year in the U.S. That’s 74 every day, 3 every hour. 	
<p>THE PROBLEM Describe the problem in 2-3 short points. Offer a vivid example, if time.</p>	<p>Falls are prevalent, painful and costly.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One in four older people fall every year. Injuries from falls are the leading cause of injury-related deaths in Wisconsin. • Falls cost Wisconsin nearly \$800 million a year in hospital and emergency department charges, 70% borne by public programs like Medicare and Medicaid. • Falls happen for a lot of reasons: loss of balance and strength, hazards in the home, poor vision, effects of medication – even the wrong shoes. 	
<p>THE SOLUTION Describe how your program or intervention solves the problem.</p>	<p>Falls are not a normal part of aging. They can be prevented. Older adults can learn the skills to reduce their risk.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wisconsin’s Stepping On 7-week, low or no cost community workshop is researched and proven to reduce the risk of falls by over 30%! • Stepping On helps older adults learn strategies to prevent falls and increase their confidence in doing so. • Fewer falls means fewer ambulance rides and hospital and doctor visits. And more independence.
